

# COMPTON FETE

Well, the gods were smiling once again on Fete day in Compton! A heavy, but brief, shower right at the start sent everyone scurrying for shelter and covering their stalls in plastic but after that the sun came out, the crowds descended, and another hugely successful day was enjoyed by hundreds of people. Compton Fete is a fixture in many people's diaries from year to year, and they come from far and wide. Clearly we have a formula that works – free entry, free parking, free children's entertainment, free races for children and dogs, and many free attractions on various stalls. For the rest, nothing is very expensive and everything is run by the villagers and their friends, for the benefit of the village. An amazing £10,572 profit was the result - which may be subject to some minor changes.

Here are the details, with last year's figures in brackets. Figures in **bold underlined** indicate a record for that particular stall. Several records were broken again this year.

### COMPTON VILLAGE PROJECTS

At the recent AGM of Compton Village Association, it was agreed that £24,500, previously belonging to the Minibus Fund, should be re-allocated and used in future for village projects. This money is no longer needed for the minibus due to the joint venture with Watts Gallery for the new Compo.

As a result, the CVA now has a total of £34,000 available for village projects and it will be working very closely with the Parish Council to identify how this sum could be used in the best interests of the village. The Parish Council also has funds available for this purpose and the village is fortunate in having this resource at a time when local authorities have limited budgets.

The Parish Council and the CVA are therefore now asking all Compton residents where they would like to see this money spent. We have sufficient resources available to make a real difference if we opted for a major project or we could support a number of smaller ones.

# PHYSICAL ENERGY – AN INVITATION TO AN EXHIBITION, DISCUSSION, TEA AND DRINKS, AT THE OLD KILN, WATTS GALLERY, BETWEEN 5PM AND 7PM, ON WEDNESDAY 21st June.

In the Watts Bicentenary year, as well as celebrating his art, philanthropy and musical connections, Watts Gallery Trust, with support from Surrey County Council and Guildford Borough Council, is seeking to site a bronze cast of *Physical Energy*, Watts's monumental equestrian sculpture, on the outer limits of its property. The idea is for the work to be enjoyed as public art, to mark the rich

cultural heritage of Surrey and the South East, and to celebrate the strong connections with equestrian pursuits.

As part of the planning and consultation for this project, Watts Gallery Trust and Surrey County Council would like to invite Compton residents to visit *A Life in Art: G F Watts 1817-1904*, a small exhibition which includes a model and drawing of *Physical Energy*, and to enjoy tea, cake and drinks, while discussing the proposed siting of this monumental sculpture, of which three other bronzes exist – one in Kensington Gardens and two in Africa.

# G F WATTS: ENGLAND'S MICHELANGELO TUESDAY 20th JUNE TO SUNDAY 26<sup>th</sup> NOVEMBER

G F Watts (1817-1904) had a career spanning over 70 years, and he inspired many household names including Rossetti, Tennyson, Leighton, Picasso, Lucien Freud and Barack Obama. Celebrating 200 years since his birth, *England's Michelangelo* explores Watts as a painter, social activist and philanthropist.

Explore the major themes of Watts's art: colour, cosmos and celebrity. View the artist's most striking masterpieces, borrowed from public and private collections and showcased in his own historic picture gallery. See one of the nation's favourite portraits, *Choosing* (1864, National Portrait Gallery), displayed alongside powerful protest paintings and abstract canvases, such as *The Sower of the Systems* (1902, Art Gallery of Ontario), which is returning to the UK for the first time in over a century. At the heart of the show are Watts's most ambitious allegorical and Symbolist works, including the iconic *Hope* (1886, private collection) and *Love and Life* (1880s, private collection), which formerly hung in the White House. Don't miss this fantastic opportunity to enjoy Watts at his very best.
